Jim and Paula Henry of Midland, Texas established The Henry Foundation on August 9, 2006, to serve as a vehicle for carrying out their philanthropic interests and charitable endeavors.

# GEOGRAPHIC IMPACT



The Henry Foundation gave a total of **106** grants to **84** organizations across the Permian Basin and greater United States.

## FUNDS AWARDED BY AREA:

Midland: 78- \$2,124,453\*

Greater Texas Region: 19- \$228,824

National: 9- \$109,222

\*7 of these grants were made to organizations who serve the greater Permian Basin Region.

The priority of The Henry Foundation remains in Midland, TX. Projects funded outside the region are given through board directed gifts or through the work of the second and third generation members.

### SAMARITAN CENTER

---

Samaritan celebrated their 50th anniversary in November of 2023. In addition to this monumental occasion, the organization also launched their psychiatric mental health care initiative, which included bringing a psychiatric nurse practitioner on staff. The Henry Foundation was pleased to contribute to this effort.



During a series of site visits, Henry Foundation staff began to identify missed connection points between health agencies. Many were serving identical or similar populations, but had no referral process or point of contact amongst each other. To address this gap, the foundation began to hold a series of meetings where organizations in this sector began networking and collaborating to address common trends. Through this collaboration, we have seen issues such as client transportation, mission awareness, external referral processes, and general human resource questions resolved. We look forward to growing this effort in years to come.
